## About the FLAD Forum Portugal and USA Higher Education

# FLAD Forum 2024 edition:

FLAD's 2nd Biennial Forum on the internationalization of Portuguese Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) will take place at the Luso-American Development Foundation Auditorium, on October 21, 2024.

Portugal, like other Southern European countries, is facing significant demographic headwinds in its higher education sector. Immigration, one of the most obvious solutions for countries with low birth rates, is quickly becoming a more salient political and cultural issue for the Portuguese, as has been the case for some time now in other European states. Increasingly, the public debate in Portugal has revolved around how best to attract and retain global talent—including Portuguese graduates capable of working anywhere. One way that universities and

polytechnics in Portugal have responded is by actively developing their internationalization strategies, through new partnerships and consortia with foreign universities, as well as closer links with companies and non-profit civil society organizations outside of academia. FCT, the Portuguese national science foundation, Erasmus+ and FLAD, just to give three examples, have put new sources of funding into creating such partnerships, of which this Forum is just a part.

In this the 2<sup>nd</sup> Biennial FLAD Forum on Internationalization, experts from Europe, the USA and elsewhere will share their best practices for how to create self-sustaining internationalization partnerships with real impact. Participants will meet and engage with the invited speakers in a day-long participatory discussion format that will allow for significant interactions, following brief presentations by each of the speakers. Networking opportunities for all the participants will also round out the program.

#### **FLAD Forum General Presentation and Objectives**

The Forum's primary objective is aligned with the mission of FLAD and the ongoing internationalization education projects that it supports: the USA-Portugal Campus initiative; the Study in Portugal Network (SiPN), which has now brought over 1700 students from the USA to Portugal since it started in 2014; and the FLAD UP-Higher Education Internationalization Grant program. Together and with the assistance of a diverse array of institutional partners in Europe and the USA, our project has created a strategy for bringing the USA and Portugal closer together in terms of higher education academic mobility, particularly in terms of giving greater visibility to Portugal in the USA as a destination for study and research.

Simultaneously, our goal is to reinforce and expand on the community know-how of administrative staff and top decision makers who work on internationalization at all levels of Portugal's higher education institutions (HEIs). In particular, our goal is to provide knowledge about the US higher education system and how Portuguese HEIs can build their own capacity for more student, staff, and/or faculty mobility to/from the USA.

The Forum seeks to bring both US and European speakers together to focus on key issues and successful case studies that have not been fully elsewhere. The speakers' profiles and experience will shed light on the "state of the art" for each particular issue area covered in the panels – be it a case from the Portuguese, European or US systems of higher education.
